DAVID WEITZ NAMED DIRECTOR OF APPLIED BUILDING SCIENCE AT CONSERVATION SERVICES GROUP

WESTBOROUGH, Mass., Feb. 15, 2007 – Stephen L. Cowell, chief executive officer of Conservation Services Group (CSG), today announced David Weitz as applied building science director. In this new position, Weitz is responsible for overseeing general technical consistency among all of CSG's building programs and the establishment of company-wide uniform technical standards, policies and procedures. Most recently, Weitz served as executive director of the Building Codes Assistance Project where he led the organization's efforts to achieve widespread adoption of the most recent energy codes throughout the U.S. He began his career as a construction worker, foreman and independent contractor in California and New York.
